Commission Members Present: City of Modesto Councilmember/President, Nick Bavaro; Stanislaus County Board of Supervisor/Vice-President, Mani Grewal; Stanislaus County Board of Supervisor, Buck Condit; City of Modesto Mayor, Sue Zwahlen

Meeting called to order at 1:35 pm by President Nick Bavaro.

- 4.0 Consideration of Implementation Options for the Stanislaus Regional 9-1-1 Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) Project and Possible Direction

Stanislaus Regional 9-1-1 (SR911) Executive Director Kasey Young (Young) at the Commission's direction, explored options to support the Sheriff's Office's interest in using Oracle CAD, including potential integration with Central Square and impacts on interoperability. Four meetings were held with representatives from the Sheriff's Office, Modesto Police Department, Modesto City Fire, Stanislaus County Fire, SR911, and IT staff from the Sheriff's Office, Oracle, and Central Square. The Sheriff's Office designated a staff member for necessary Central Square configuration. Young presented four options for moving forward, all requiring some level of participation from the Sheriff's Office.

Public Comment:

- Stanislaus County Sheriff's Office Captain Tori Hughes expressed concerns about the Sheriff's Office transitioning to Central Square (CS), citing outdated technology, lack of readiness, and missing system integrations. With only 30 business days left, she said going live is logistically impossible and offers no operational benefit. She emphasized that the Sheriff has been clear about not going to Central Square (CS) and being on the Oracle platform instead.
- City of Modesto Police Chief Brandon Gillespie emphasized that the decision to adopt Central Square (CS) was made collectively by the commission, not just Modesto, and Oracle was never approved. He expressed frustration over delays caused by the Sheriff's Office opting out and stressed the need to move forward with CS due to the instability of the current system.
- When asked by the commission whether there was any intention to go to Central Square, Captain Hughes responded that there were no plans to do so and stated they would resort to pen and paper if necessary.
- Stanislaus County Sheriff's Office Lieutenant Brock Condit addressed the pen and paper comment and shared that statement does not affect response times. They still have computers in their vehicle to access information they just won't receive dispatch calls to their CAD system.

Commission members shared statements, asked clarifying questions, and expressed their support for moving forward with Central Square. The Commission directed the Executive Director to continue as planned, with the go-live date set for on or around September 23, 2025.
